The *Critique of the Power of Judgment* is easily the most interesting, but also the most difficult of Kant's three *Critiques*. Rather than define the sphere of either theoretical or practical knowledge, as he did in the first two *Critiques*, Kant here was concerned to find the unity of these spheres and the faculties that determine them. The unification of understanding and reason, and of nature and freedom was sought through the "power of judgment" [*Urteilskraft*]. We will read the book in its entirety, paying attention both to Kant's broader concerns with unity and system, and to his specific discussions of beauty, sublimity etc.
